Course Description

This course is aimed to provide you an opportunity to explore basic concepts in Linguistics. As students of English education department, your understanding about terminologies, jargons, and the development of linguistics as a discipline will be quite helpful for your future professional development as English language teachers. Your consideration about material development, organization, presentation, and teaching quality will be very much influenced by, among others, your understanding about language. Your broad linguistic knowledge will also influence your confidence in cooperating with other linguists around the country and the world. You will be given reading lists consisting of topics and linguistics that you have to read and internalize. Then, you are obliged to share your understanding with your peers in classroom discussion sessions. Finally, you are expected to write an original argumentative essay concerning linguistic phenomenon you find in languages around you.

Course Objective

At the end of the course, the course participants are expected to be able to:

- 1) Explain basic concepts in linguistics.
- 2) Write a critical argumentative essay concerning linguistic phenomenon

Assessment

- 1) Grade A will be given if you could do 85% of the mid test questions and produce an original publishable argumentative essay in linguistics
- 2) Grade B will be given if you could do 75% of the mid test questions and produce a critical argumentative essay in linguistics
- 3) Grade C will be awarded if you could produce 65% of the mid test questions and produced a mediocre essay in linguistics
- 4) Grade E will be awarded if you are involved in plagiarism, poor attendance, do not join mid test, or do not submit final paper.
